Old Testament Reading *(please be seated)*

Genesis 4:1-16

Now Adam knew Eve his wife, and she conceived and bore Cain, saying, "I have gotten a man with the help of the Lord."² And again, she bore his brother Abel. Now Abel was a keeper of sheep, and Cain a worker of the ground.³ In the course of time Cain brought to the Lord an offering of the fruit of the ground,⁴ and Abel also brought of the firstborn of his flock and of their fat portions. And the Lord had regard for Abel and his offering,⁵ but for Cain and his offering he had no regard. So Cain was very angry, and his face fell.⁶ The Lord said to Cain, "Why are you angry, and why has your face fallen?"⁷ If you do well, will you not be accepted? And if you do not do well, sin is crouching at the door. Its desire is for you, but you must rule over it."⁸ Cain spoke to Abel his brother. And when they were in the field, Cain rose up against his brother Abel and killed him.⁹ Then the Lord said to Cain, "Where is Abel your brother?" He said, "I do not know; am I my brother's keeper?"¹⁰ And the Lord said, "What have you done? The voice of your brother's blood is crying to me from the ground.¹¹ And now you are cursed from the ground, which has opened its mouth to receive your brother's blood from your hand.¹² When you work the ground, it shall no longer yield to you its strength. You shall be a fugitive and a wanderer on the earth."¹³ Cain said to the Lord, "My punishment is greater than I can bear.¹⁴ Behold, you have driven me today away from the ground, and from your face I shall be hidden. I shall be a fugitive and a wanderer on the earth, and whoever finds me will kill me."¹⁵ Then the Lord said to him, "Not so! If anyone kills Cain, vengeance shall be taken on him sevenfold." And the Lord put a mark on Cain, lest any who found him should attack him.¹⁶ Then Cain went away from the presence of the Lord and settled in the land of Nod, east of Eden.

Holy and gracious Father: In Your infinite love You made us for Yourself; and, when we had rebelled against You, fallen into sin and become subject to evil and death, You, in Your mercy, sent Jesus Christ, Your only and eternal Son, to share our human nature, to live and die as one of us, to reconcile us to You, the God and Father of all. He stretched out His arms upon the cross, and offered Himself, in obedience to Your will, a perfect sacrifice for the whole world.

Dear Resurrection Family and Friends,

One of my favorite verses has become Psalm 127:1: *“Unless the Lord builds the house, the laborers labor in vain.”* I often recite this verse as I begin my prayers for the church, my family, and the world to remind myself that God is in charge and He is building His Kingdom here and now. My job in life is to join Him in what He is doing!

The problem is, I want God to work and build in my time and in my way right now! What was true of Adam and Eve in Genesis 3 is true of me: I don't trust God has my best interests at heart, or that His plan for the world is the best plan for me. So I usurp His position as God and seek to control my own life and circumstances. Of course I then get frustrated at Him when my plans don't work out. This produces constant unmet expectations, which leads to lack of trust.

Dr. John Rodgers, former Dean President of Trinity School for Ministry, is fond of saying, *“Remember, God works the other side of the street.”* In other words, while we can only see our side of things, God is working behind the scenes and in other's lives in ways we can't see until much later. The key is learning to trust Him even when we can't see beyond our side of the street.

What is your response to unmet needs or seemingly unanswered prayers? Anger? Frustration? Impatience? Moving forward in your own strength? Or have you learned to more and more trust, wait, pray, listen, walk and work in the power of the Holy Spirit in the circumstances you are in now?

God is inviting us to join Him in His great work we call Life. And as we do, He is faithful not only by weaning us off our idols, answering our prayers, and meeting our needs, but also by changing us into people who reflect the Kingdom Citizens we were created to be.
